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# INNOVATIVE LEARNING AT SANGGAR BIMBINGAN KUALA LANGAT SELANGOR TO ACHIEVE SDGs

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Malaysia, July 2, 2023 — In an effort to support the achievement of global education targets in SDGs, namely ensuring the quality of inclusive and equitable education and increasing lifelong learning opportunities for all, S1 Office Administration Education Study Program at Universitas Negeri Malang carried out an Overseas Partnership Service (PKLN) activity at the Sanggar Bimbingan Kuala Langat, Selangor, Malaysia, with the title “Improving the Quality of Learning and Understanding of Teachers and Parents at the Sanggar Bimbingan Kuala Langat with the Flipped Classroom Learning Model”. This activity focuses on educators,

parents/guardians, and Indonesian students who are currently in Malaysia, especially Selangor, Malaysia. SDGs targets cover various aspects of education including participation, quality and learning outcomes, school infrastructure, quality of educators and safety and hygiene in schools.



In SDGs, it is important to eliminate gender disparities in education to help United Nations member states achieve the SDGs. In addition to completing education equally and with quality, UNESCO ensures that both women and men have equal access to the same education. The e-learning program that has been designed by the government and in accordance with this service program carried out is a positive step that makes Indonesia not only seen as a developing country that only takes care of all the country's development processes but also develops the leading sector of digital learning. Therefore, Indonesia must make SDGs a reference to realize superior human resources. This activity is in line with the goal of SDGs itself, namely improving the quality of education/learning.



In this activity, which was carried out by lecturers through the Institute for Research and Community Service (LP2M) of the Universitas Negeri Malang in collaboration with the Sekolah Indonesia Kuala Lumpur (SIKL) and the Sanggar Bimbingan Kuala Langat, there were two lecturers including Dr. Madziah, S.Pd., M.M and Yuli Agustina, S.E., M.M. and four students who are members of this activity, namely Eka Novianti A, Inneke Camelia N. C., Moch. Yusufa Albar B., and M. Habib Al Azhar will spend approximately four days in Selangor, Malaysia from July 1st until July 4th 2023. They did a service by creating changes regarding the learning process at the Studio, which was originally manual and changed to automatic and structured with the help of the google classroom platform.



The team is involved in a project that focuses on education. They work closely with Sekolah Indonesia Kuala Lumpur (SIKL) which is under the auspices of the Indonesian Embassy in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and of course work with local institutions to design and implement activities that can provide long-term benefits for the entire community in the Kuala Langat Guidance Studio.

in this activity, said that this program was in order to add insight and establish cooperation with foreign parties.

This program is expected to be an effort to improve bilateral relations between Indonesia and Malaysia, especially the Universitas Negeri Malang with the Kuala Lumpur Indonesian School and the Sanggar Bimbingan Kuala Langat. Through dedication and exchange of knowledge and experience, it is hoped that closer cooperation between the two countries in the field of education can be established.

After approximately 4 days of service in Malaysia, the lecturers and students returned to Indonesia with new experiences and insights that can be applied in everyday life as well as in the world of work in the future.

Through this activity, the Overseas Partnership Service (PKLN) program is expected to create a real positive impact on the Indonesian people, especially the Indonesian Workers who are abroad and certainly strengthen the bond between the two countries.



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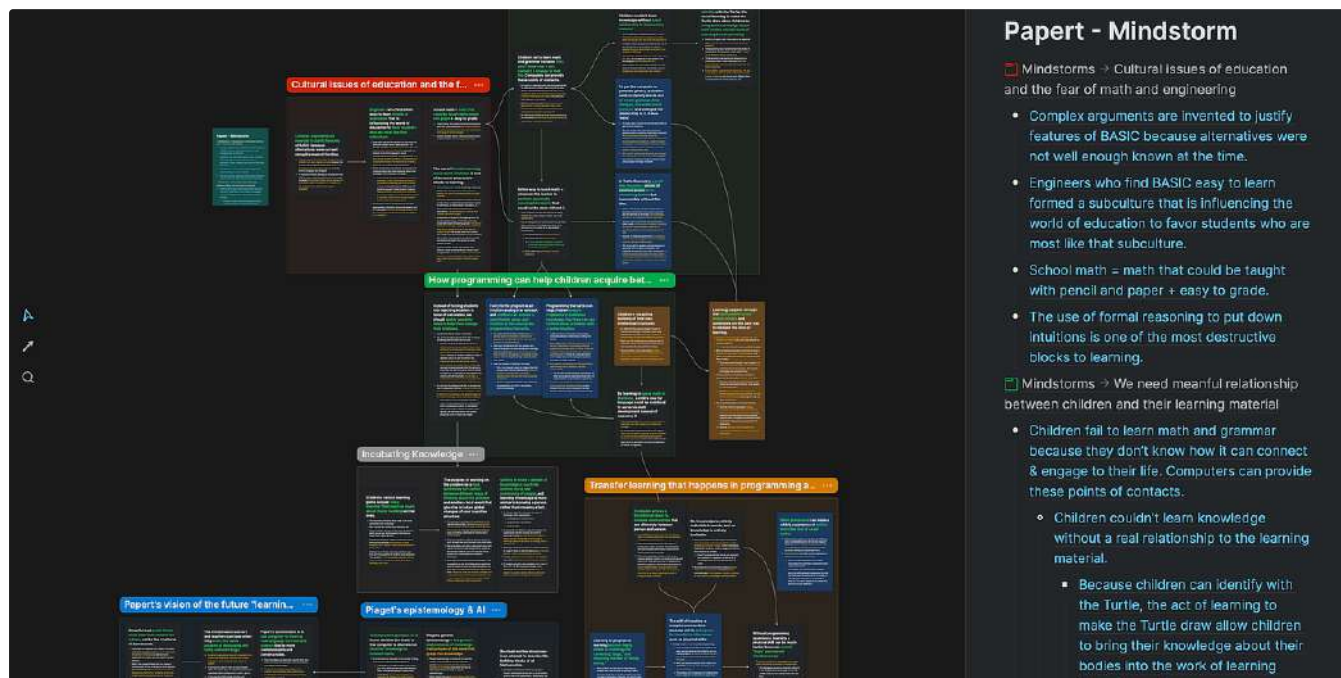


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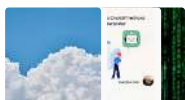
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
