HISTORY OF UDAYANA UNIVERSITY

The forerunner of Udayana University (Unud) was the Udayana Faculty of Letters branch of Airlangga University which was inaugurated by P. J. M. President of the Republic of Indonesia Ir. Soekarno, opened by J. M. Minister P.P and K. Prof. DR. Prijono on September 29 1958 as written on the inscription at the Faculty of Letters on Jalan Nias Denpasar.







The Faculty of Letters was founded on the initiative of the Nusa Tenggara Faculties Foundation, which was known by Lt. Col. Minggoe and Deputy Chair I, Governor of Lesser Sunda, Teuku Mochamad Daoedsjah. This foundation collaborates with people who have special expertise in the field of literature, such as Dr. R. Goris, Dr. Ida Bagus Mantra and I Gusti Ketut Ranuh. These figures, apart from preparing things related to the physical aspect, also act as liaisons, to find people who will become lecturers (teaching staff), especially people who will become leaders of the Faculty that will be formed. The person who was successfully contacted, who will become the leader, is Prof. Dr. R.M. Ng. Poerbatjaraka, who at that time was Dean of the Faculty of Letters and Culture, Gadjah Mada University. The teaching staff who were contacted, especially staff who had doctoral degrees and had gained international fame because of their scientific achievements at that time, were (1) Prof. Dr. R.M. Ng. Poerbatjaraka, (2) Dr. R. Goris, (3) Prof. Dr. Ida Bagus Mantra, and (4) Prof. Dr. Swami Teachinganda.

At its inception (September - December 1958), the Udayana Faculty of Letters was managed by the Nusa Tenggara Faculties Foundation, but starting on January 1 1959 it officially became part of Airlangga University. Since then, the Udayana Faculty of Letters has changed its name to the Faculty of Letters.

This Udayana Faculty of Letters is the embryo of the founding of Udayana University, based on the Decree of the Minister of PTIP No. 104/1962, dated 9 August 1962, Udayana University was legally established on 17 August 1962. Because the University's birthday falls on the same day as the Proclamation of Independence Republic of Indonesia, then the celebration of Udayana University's birthday was moved to September 29, taking the date of the inauguration of the Faculty of Letters which was inaugurated on September 29 1958, but the de jure year of birth was 1962.

At the age of 62, Udayana University is led by 12 Chancellors consisting of: (1) Prof. Dr. Ida Bagus Mantra (1962-1970); (2) Prof. Dr. I Gst. Ngr. VISION MISSION AND PURPOSE

Udayana University's Vision

Udayana University seeks to be a leading university that produces high potential graduates who become the best in their generation. We It also aims to have graduates who develop further towards self-reliance; and remain fully engaged with our local indigenous knowledge and practices.

The university's vision stated in the 2017 statute is **becoming an excellent, self-reliance and culture-oriented university**

To achieve similar perception and understanding on the direction of the university's long-term development for the academic and administrative staff, as well as the students (civitas academica), the vision description is outlined as follows.

Excellent refers to those who are highly competent, competitive and wise in developing their knowledge to enhance values of the state, nation, and human beings in general (referred as cakra widya prawartana). Such outstanding human resources are alligned to the university's motto *takitakining sewake guna widya*.

Self-reliance refers to those who develop strong personality and ability in interacting with their dynamically changing environment.

Culture-oriented refers to those who develop inner sensitivity and sharpness that enable the utilization of great local cultural values, which are universal in nature for social interaction.

To achieve this vision, the higher education missions reflected at Udayana University are as follows:

- 1. Conducting a qualified higher education to produce high morale and integrity graduates in accordance with the demands of local, national, and international community;
- 2. Developing research and community service on the basis of nation and community interests;
- 3. Empowering Udayana University as an institution that produces and develops knowledge, technology, and culture for the society welfare; and
- 4. Producing innovative and prospective works for the development of Udayana University as well as the national economy.

Udayana University's Purpose

- 1. Producing excellent graduates of high competence in science, technology, and arts;
- 2. Increasing the capacity of Udayana University in providing educational access for the community;
- 3. Developing good governance by optimizing the roles of organizational elements according to the principles of public service institution;
- 4. Establishing cooperation in various fields to improve the quality of *Tridharma* (education, research, and community services);

- 5. Producing high-quality, relevant, and competitive research according to the development of science, technology, and art; and
- 6. Producing national and international scientific publications and intellectual property rights for the benefit of society.

Main Duties and Functions of Udayana University

Udayana University has the duties and functions of implementing higher education which includes academic, vocational and professional education programs, research, and community service in the fields of science and technology, in accordance with the provisions of statutory regulations, as stated in the Regulation of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia Number 30 of 2016 concerning the Organization and Work Procedures of Udayana University.

UNUD SYMBOL MEANING



Unud's symbol named Widya Cakra Prawartana which means the wheels of science is based on Pancasila. The meaning of the symbols are:

- 1. Having the shape of a circle with a wheel disc, in the middle, there is a Padma (lotus) with eight leaves, which symbolize the eight wind points, which symbolize the sanctity of God Almighty, which is the first principle of Pancasila.
- 2. The wheel disc has four trellis, symbolizing the steel-like strength of four Pancasila principles.
- 3. The outside of the radius of the circle wheel adorned with 54 (fifty-four) points as Ratna Permata in accordance with the sequence of science which are given by Udayana University.
- 4. The symbol's color is golden yellow with a blue base color. Golden yellow color symbolizes the sun rise and blue color symbolizes the sky.
