AGREEMENT TYPE:

Advanced Payment and Cost Reimbursable Agreement

This subaward is entered into on September 1, 2020 by and between American Councils for International Education (hereinafter referred to as American Councils), and Universitas Negeri Malang (hereinafter referred to as Subrecipient), is for the performance of certain work/services and reimbursement of allowable costs.

BACKGROUND

American Councils has received from US Department of State, ECA (hereinafter referred to as Federal Agency), an Award entitled, "Critical Language Scholarship (CLS) Program" (hereinafter referred to as Award), with an Award number of S-ECAGD-19-CA-0037-2020 and a federal CFDA number of 19.009.

In addition to the terms and conditions described below, the Subrecipient also agrees to abide by all terms and conditions set forth under the Subaward.

The Subrecipient has applied for and received a D-U-N-S Number (726529691), and will maintain the D-U-N-S Number through the period of performance of this award. While SAM (System for Award Management) Registration is not required, it is highly recommended that partners maintain their SAM Registration through the period of performance of this award.

This agreement defines the responsibilities and deliverables of the Subrecipient and American Councils for the administration of a CLS virtual institute to support the study of approximately 13 U.S. undergraduate and graduate students, at least 18 years old at time of application to the program, during the summer of 2020. The responsibilities, processes, and procedures defined herein have been developed and implemented to comply with the requirements stipulated in the Subaward issued by the U.S. Department of State. Therefore, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE I - Scope of Work

The **Subrecipient** agrees to perform the work outlined by Dr. Jeanette Owen, CLS Program Director and Syejeong Kim, CLS Program Officer, hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

i. <u>Project Responsibilities</u>

- As a partner to American Councils for CLS, the Subrecipient shall provide a virtual language and cultural program for approximately 13 U.S. undergraduate and graduate students during the autumn of 2020.
- Participants shall attend a minimum of approximately 4 hours per week of language instruction to be provided by qualified faculty; faculty shall provide regular feedback and assessment, including provision of final grades.
- 3. The **Subrecipient** shall pair participants with suitable language partners for the duration of the program, with meetings taking place approximately twice per week.
- 4. The Subrecipient shall provide an orientation and training for staff, teachers, and language partners, including training on support for diverse students and the CLS Sexual Harassment Policy and how it applies in the virtual environment.

ii. <u>Deliverables</u>

The **Subrecipient** agrees to provide the following program deliverables and respond to problems related to the following program parameters.

- Language and Cultural Program: The Subrecipient agrees to provide a summer language and cultural program for approximately 13 participants for 7 weeks. These classes shall be designed for, and attended by, CLS participants only.
 - This program shall include a minimum of approximately 4 hours per week of classroom instruction.
 - Class size shall not exceed 10 participants, without prior approval from American Councils.
 - Participants shall be placed by the Subrecipient into classes appropriate to their language level, as determined by a placement process conducted by the Subrecipient. Participants are accepted to the program at the beginning, advanced beginning, intermediate and advanced levels.
 - The Subrecipient shall provide course descriptions for each level; any changes to course descriptions must be approved by American Councils prior to the start of the program.
 - Teachers shall track participant progress throughout the summer and the Subrecipient will submit final grades to American Councils within 10 days of the final day of classes.
 - If a participant is significantly more or less proficient than the majority of the group, the Subrecipient agrees to develop and provide him or her with reasonable supplemental activities to address his or her individual needs. This may include, but is not limited to: one-on-one tutorials, supervised independent study, and additional out-of-class assignments. The Subrecipient should discuss individual needs with the CLS Program Officer in advance of implementing; adjustments that affect the total program cost shall be submitted to the CLS Program Director for approvals in advance.
 - The **Subrecipient** shall provide training sessions on sexual harassment and diversity for the teachers designated to serve as instructors for the CLS Program as part of their preparation for the academic program. In addition, these trainings should be provided to other program affiliates such as language partners. Sample training materials are provided by American Councils as a separate attachment, though partners may use their own materials.

- 2. Pre-Program Orientation: The Subrecipient shall collaborate with American Councils to provide participants with an orientation prior to the start of the virtual institute. The Program Officer will be responsible for organizing and delivering most sessions, but will also work with the Subrecipient to determine appropriate content. The orientation should cover:
 - An overview of the academic program including information about the Learning Management System (or "course website"), how students will receive and submit assignments, how to access course sessions, overview of grading procedures, description of major assignments, etc.
 - An introduction of faculty and staff. This should include a document detailing names and contact information for all relevant staff.
- Language Partners: As part of the academic program, the Subrecipient agrees to develop a
 program that pairs CLS participants with language partners for the purposes of one-on-one
 language development.
 - The **Subrecipient** shall designate a staff member who will act as Language Partner Coordinator; that person will be responsible for all aspects of the language partner program. These responsibilities may include: recruiting, training, disbursing honoraria, scheduling, maintaining regular communication, and collecting reports, among other activities.
 - Qualified language partners will be recruited in advance of the program, and trained by the Subrecipient.
 - Each participant shall be paired with one language partner.
 - The Subrecipient shall work with the American Councils to match language partners with each program participant.
 - Language partners shall be required to meet with students for a minimum of 2 hours each week.
 - The Subrecipient will provide an orientation session for the language partners, including a sexual harassment training and a diversity training. American Councils will provide supporting materials for these trainings separately.
- Institute Plan: The Subrecipient agrees to work with American Councils to finalize an overview of planned program activities by September 15, 2020, using the CLS Virtual Institute Plan template.
- Participant Data: American Councils shall provide the Subrecipient with participant names, biographical information and academic background by September 15, 2020.

iii. Communication between American Councils and Subrecipient:

- The Program Officer will be the main point of contact at American Councils and the Institute Director will serve as the main point of contact of the host institution for the duration of the subaward period.
- The American Councils' Program Officer will provide additional support to CLS participants, including academic and cultural advising. The Program Officer will be available outside of regular business hour.
- The Institute Director and Program Officer will maintain regular communication throughout the duration of the program via phone, email, and instant messaging services.
- The Institute Director will bring to the Program Officer's attention any issues related to student behavior and academic performance.
- iv. The Subrecipient shall appoint a staff responsible for working with faculty, staff, language partners, and others affiliated with the CLS Program to provide trainings regarding sexual

harassment and diversity, using materials provided by American Councils or materials that can be adapted for the CLS Program trainings.

- a. Sexual Harassment Policy: The U.S. Department of State, American Councils, and the CLS Program expressly prohibit sexual harassment and sexual violence in all of its programs and at all of its locations, including homestays and social settings where students gather as part of their participation in the program. This policy applies to the conduct of all students, staff, and third parties that work with CLS Program participants. When Subrecipient program staff know of possible sexual harassment, including sexual violence, it will report incidents to American Councils staff. If a review reveals that a violation of this policy occurred, the Subrecipient and American Councils will coordinate to take prompt and effective steps reasonably calculated to end the harassment, eliminate the hostile environment, prevent the harassment from recurring, and, as appropriate, remedy its effects.
- b. Diversity: The Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U. S. Department of State strives to ensure that its efforts reflect the diversity of U.S. society and societies abroad. The Bureau seeks and encourages the involvement of people from traditionally underrepresented audiences in all its grants, programs and other activities and in its workforce and workplace. Opportunities are open to people regardless of their race, color, national origin, sex, age, religion, geographic location, socio-economic status, disability (physical or mental), sexual orientation or gender identity. The Bureau is committed to fairness, equity and inclusion. The CLS Program seeks to represent the full diversity of the U.S. student body, including students from a wide range of institutions (public and private universities, minority-serving institutions, community colleges), geographic regions and fields of study.
- v. The Subrecipient shall assist American Councils (should American Councils deem it necessary) in reviewing, investigating, and addressing concerns related to institute staff, instructors, language partners and others affiliated with the CLS Program, in keeping with the host institution personnel and sexual harassment policies and those of American Councils. CLS Program participants are also required to adhere to the program policies, including the CLS Program sexual harassment policy and all program policy guidance regarding code of conduct.

Please note that American Councils does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex, sexual orientation, religion, age, national origin, or disability (which does not prevent an employee from performing the functions of the employee's job). American Councils is an equal opportunity employer in its employment policies and practices, educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship and loan programs, and other American Councils-administered programs.

ARTICLE II - Period of Performance

The term of this subaward shall extend from September 1, 2020 through November 30, 2020. Unless stated elsewhere in this subaward, Subrecipient's expenditures incurred prior to the beginning date or subsequent to the end date are unallowable. Subrecipient shall notify American Councils, as soon as possible, of any reason that might contribute to the failure to perform within the specified term even if such reason is beyond the control and without fault or negligence of the Subrecipient. The performance period may be modified by mutual agreement in writing of the parties.

Article III. Key Personnel

Dr. Gatut Susanto shall be responsible for the completion of the subrecipient's component tasks, as set forth in the **Article I**, **Scope of Work**. American Councils has agreed to provide a modest compensation to Dr. Susanto and one other key staff personnel under a separate consulting agreement.

ARTICLE IV - Consideration, Records and Billing Instructions

- All expenditures paid with funds provided by this Subaward must be incurred for authorized activities, which take place during this period, unless otherwise stipulated. Payment of funds under this Subaward will not be disbursed until American Councils has been assured that the Subrecipient's financial management system will provide effective control over and accountability for all Federal funds in accordance with 2 CFR 200.300 200.303.
- 2. American Councils and the U.S. Department of State appreciates cost sharing on the part of CLS subrecipients. Allowable cost sharing includes those costs that benefit the program and are eligible to be charged to the CLS award, but are covered by the Subrecipient as a commitment to the program. Examples of cost share may include but are not limited to, discounts for goods and services received due to Subrecipient established relationships, office space, language learning materials, costs for language partners and teachers, and office supplies. A cost share report using the template provided in Attachment 5 shall accompany any cost share reported in the final financial report.
- The total compensation to be paid for Subrecipient's activities shall not exceed \$15,080.00, based on the budget outlined in Attachment 1 hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. American Councils' payment to Subrecipient shall be based upon the terms and conditions as specified in this subaward, Federal award and the availability and allocation of Federal Agency's funds, necessary to finance performance.
- The determination of allowable costs for Subrecipient's activities shall be made in accordance with 2 CFR 200, Subpart E - Cost Principles, inclusive of all amendments in effect as of the date of this agreement.
- 6. Subrecipient shall maintain reasonable records incident to the performance of this subaward and shall allow American Councils and/or Federal agency access to these records. At any time American Councils may request additional documentation to support charges on the invoice. Subrecipient should permit American Councils to have access to the subrecipient's records and financial statements as necessary for audit purposes.
- 7. Payment will be provided upon receipt of invoices (a) identified by the ID number located on the top of the first subaward page, (b) reflecting the cost categories as outlined in the budget (Attachment 1), and (c) approved and signed by the Subrecipient's appropriate administrative official. Invoices shall provide a current and cumulative breakdown of costs and required cost sharing in separate columns using the invoice template provided in Attachment 2 and 3. Deviations from this template must be approved in advance by American Councils.
- 8. Up to 80% of the program budget may be requested in the form of an advance payment from American Councils. An invoice for the advance payment may be submitted in August for an advance payment issued in September. Due to the short-term nature of the CLS Program, the advance payment is designed to cover costs incurred before the start of the program and initial program period. This includes pre-program activities such as payments to staff assigned to

- prepare CLS Program institute plans; develop the academic curriculum; select and train teachers; recruit, screen, and train language partners. The advance payment also provides for the initial payments to CLS Program teaching staff, language partners, and administrative staff. An invoice estimating the distribution of the advance request based on the budget included in Attachment 1 must be submitted to American Councils before payments can be authorized.
- 9. The remaining 20% of program costs may be invoiced upon completion of the program. An itemized invoice must be submitted to American Councils in order to receive the remaining program costs. The Final Invoice shall be clearly identified as "final" and shall be submitted no later than 30 days after the subaward's end date. Invoices received after that are subject to not being paid.
- 10. Currency exchange. Cost increases for fluctuations in exchange rates is subject to the availability of funding. Prior approval of exchange rate fluctuations is required only when the change results in the need for additional Federal funding. Payment shall be made in USD to an account designated by the Subrecipient, and remittance charge shall be borne by American Councils. In the event of a currency fluctuation, the partner may request an amendment to the program budget.
- 11. American Councils agrees to reimburse the Subrecipient within 20 business days of receipt of an approved invoice.
- 12. American Councils shall make no payments without receipt of invoice.
- 13. Subrecipient's charges for salaries and wages must be based on records that accurately reflect the work performed (2CFR200. 430). Individuals can be specifically identified with the project.
- 14. It is understood and agreed that the Subrecipient must provide the minimum amount of cost sharing as stipulated in the approved budget (see Attachment 1). Cost sharing may be in the form of allowable direct or indirect costs. The Subrecipient must maintain written records to support all allowable costs which are claimed as being its contribution to cost participation, as well as costs to be paid by the Federal Government. Such records are subject to audit. The basis for determining the value of cash and in-kind contributions must be in accordance with 2 CFR 200.306. In the event the Subrecipient does not provide the minimum amount of cost sharing as stipulated in the Subrecipient's approved budget, the American Councils' contribution will be reduced in proportion to the Subrecipient's contribution.
- 15. The Final Invoice shall be clearly identified as "final" and shall be submitted no later than 30 days after the subaward's end date. American Councils' Representative (Program Director) is responsible for ensuring that Subrecipient's final financial report is received within this time period.
- 16. All invoices and reports shall reference the Subaward number (see Attachment 2, 3, and 4) and be submitted to the following address or emailed to skim@americancouncils.org (Program Officer's email address):

17. The payment of funds to Subrecipient under the terms of this Subaward shall be contingent on the receipt of such funds by American Councils from federal funding sources and shall be subject to Subrecipient's continued eligibility to receive funds under the applicable provisions of prime award.

If the amount of funds that American Councils receives from federal funding sources is reduced, American Councils reserves the right to reduce the amount of funds awarded under, or

terminate, this Subaward. In the case of a reduction of federal funding, there will be a corresponding reduction in the scope of work as agreed upon by American Councils and Subrecipient. American Councils also reserves the right to deny payment for Subrecipient's expenditures for approved services where invoices and/or other reports are not submitted by the deadlines.

ARTICLE V - Reports

- Subrecipient shall submit program reports as required by Federal Agency (ECA) and American Councils. Subrecipient shall provide a final narrative report (with English translation, if necessary) based on a provided template no later than December 21, 2020. A comparison of actual accomplishments to the objectives of the Subaward and Federal award established for the period. Where the accomplishments of the Federal award can be quantified, a computation of the cost (for example, related to units of accomplishment) may be required if that information will be useful.
- Subrecipient shall submit the final financial report no later than December 30, 2020 (see Attachment 4). Any unused funds must be returned to American Councils once the final financial report has been processed by American Councils and the amount of unused funds confirmed.

ARTICLE VI - Intellectual Property

Any intellectual property arising out of the activities assisted by this subaward shall be promptly and fully reported to American Councils' Representative. The ownership and manner of disposition of all rights in and to such intellectual property shall be subject to the regulations issued by the Federal Agency as such regulations appear in the Award between the ECA and American Councils.

ARTICLE VII - Proprietary and Confidential Information

- 1. American Councils and Subrecipient agree to use all reasonable diligence to prevent disclosure to third parties any confidential information disclosed to it under this Subaward and marked by either party as confidential for a period of three (3) years from the date of disclosure. Such information shall be disclosed in writing and marked "confidential," or if disclosed orally or in other documentary form shall be reduced to writing and marked "confidential" within thirty (30) days thereafter. Disclosure of confidential information to employees, officers, agents, and representatives shall be only on a need-to-know basis and as necessary for the purposes of this subaward. This non-disclosure obligation shall not apply to information:
 - already in or that subsequently enters the public domain through no fault of American Councils or Subrecipient;
 - presently known or becomes known to American Councils or Subrecipient from its own independent sources;
 - received by American Councils or Subrecipient from any third party not under obligation to keep such information confidential;
 - independently developed by American Councils or Subrecipient without use of the other's confidential information; or
 - 5) required to be disclosed by law.
- 2. The **Subrecipient** agrees to conform to provisions of HIPPA in protecting participants' medical records and information.
- CLS participant names, college/university names, educational status, field of study, language of study, host institute, and host country name may be publicly shared. Additional information about CLS participants may not be used without written participant permission.

ARTICLE VIII - Media & Publicity

- The Subrecipient shall consult with American Councils prior to conducting CLS Program
 publicity, including inviting or speaking with reporters and creating promotional materials.
- 2. In collaboration with American Councils, the Subrecipient and the Program Officer shall together determine the appropriateness of local media requests to publish positive stories related to CLS. In cases involving potentially negative news coverage and/or regional, national, or international media, the Subrecipient shall consult with American Councils for approval and support prior to speaking with the media. The Subrecipient shall consider the audience receiving the message; consider the potential effects of the news coverage, including effects on participant safety and the future of the program; be sensitive to the privacy of persons affiliated with CLS; and where possible, inform CLS participants ahead of time if media representatives will be present.
- The Subrecipient may use or publish photographs of CLS participants only if they were taken by CLS staff. In other cases, the Subrecipient must obtain a photo permission waiver from any CLS participants who are in a photo and took the photo.
- 4. Persons affiliated with the CLS Program may express themselves on Web sites, personal blogs, and social networks. However, they must acknowledge that the blog or Web site is not an official Department of State or CLS Program Web site and that the views expressed do not represent the CLS Program or the Department of State. Persons must maintain a standard of conduct in keeping with the spirit and intent of the CLS Program: to increase mutual understanding between people of the U.S. and the people of other countries.

ARTICLE IX - Assignments and Subcontracts

Neither performance nor payment involving the whole or any part of this subaward as described under Article I may be assigned, subcontracted, transferred, or otherwise given or imposed on any other party by **Subrecipient** without the prior written consent of American Councils. **Subrecipient** shall pass the appropriate Federal Agency information to any **Subrecipient**. As applicable, this shall include Federal Agency name, Award ID number, Award title, CFDA number and appropriate flow-down requirements.

ARTICLE X - Changes and Prior Approval

Subrecipient is responsible for both notifying American Councils and obtaining prior written approval from American Councils identified in Attachment 1 with respect to any changes that may materially alter the terms of this subaward. Examples include, but are not limited to, changes in the period of performance, in Subrecipient's Representative, significant rebudgeting, and changes in the scope of work. In the event of uncertainty as to whether a change is significant enough to require prior approval, questions shall be referred to American Councils.

ARTICLE XI - Insurance

Subrecipient shall be solely responsible for any and all third party liability insurance that might be incurred in the performance of this subaward.

ARTICLE XII - Suspension

American Councils reserves the right to suspend this subaward at any time by electronic or telephone notice to Subrecipient followed by written notice within 10 days of the initial notice. Subrecipient shall immediately stop performance and shall not perform under this subaward until receiving a resume performance notice from American Councils followed by written notice within 10 days. American Councils shall provide Subrecipient with the reason(s) for suspension and indicate if any remedies are available to Subrecipient. If American Councils and Subrecipient mutually agree the reason(s) for the suspension have been remedied, American Councils shall issue a resume performance notice to

Subrecipient. Subrecipient shall not be reimbursed or paid for any charges during the suspension period.

ARTICLE XIII - Termination

Both American Councils and Subrecipient reserve the right to terminate this subaward at any time by giving written notice to the Administrative Representative of the other party at least 30 days prior to the effective date of termination.

In the event of default, either by Subrecipient's failure to substantially perform its obligations, Subrecipient's violation of other material terms of this subaward, or Sponsor's termination of work by American Councils on the subject matter of this Award, then performance by the Subrecipient under this subaward may be terminated by American Councils at any time by giving written notice to the Subrecipient. Should performance be so terminated, the Subrecipient shall be paid for its reasonable costs and commitments to the date of termination, but only to the extent that such costs and commitments are reimbursable to American Councils under the terms of Federal Agency's Award. Payment shall be made upon submission to American Councils of a final invoice covering the aforementioned performance and submission of any and all results achieved to the time of termination and acceptance thereof by American Councils.

ARTICLE XIV - General Provisions

The following general provisions become operative if the particular subject relates to activity to be performed under this subaward.

- 1. Grant-Related Income (2CFR200. 400)
 - Subrecipient must report to American Councils any grant related income as covered by 2 CFR 200 Subpart D. Disposition of such income shall be consistent with the terms of the Federal Award.
- 2. Indirect Costs and NICRA.
 - If **Subrecipient** is a U.S.-based entity, **Subrecipient** must submit the most recent NICRA to American Councils. **Subrecipient's** indirect costs must be charged to the project according to rates prescribed in **subrecipient** NICRA (2CFR200.323).
- 3. Equipment Accountability and Disposition
 - For purposes of this subaward, equipment is defined as those items costing \$5,000 or more and having a useful life of more than two years. Except for for-profit firms/organizations, title to all equipment purchased under this subaward shall vest in Subrecipient upon acquisition unless it is determined that to do so is not in furtherance of the objectives of American Councils. Administration, internal control, and management of equipment shall comply with the requirements of 2 CFR 200 Subpart D. Except for a model change for equipment in Subrecipient's proposed budget, Subrecipient shall request prior approval from American Councils for the purchase of equipment not in Subrecipient's proposed budget, see the Attachment 1.
- 4. Internal Control
 - Subrecipient must establish and maintain effective internal control over the subaward that provides reasonable assurance that the non-federal entity is managing the federal funds in compliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the Federal award and subaward (2CFR200.303).
- Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA)
 In accordance with 2 CFR 200.211 for Federal spending transparency (e.g., FFATA), for applicable Federal awards American Councils should announce all Federal awards publicly and publish the

required information on www.USAspending.gov. American Councils identifies Universitas Negeri Malang as subject to FFATA reporting requirement: Yes. Universitas Negeri Malang is required to complete and sign Attachment 6 and return prior to the execution of subaward.

ARTICLE XV - Certifications

By accepting this subaward, Subrecipient certifies compliance with the following, if applicable:

- Non-Discrimination. Universitas Negeri Malang certifies that it is in compliance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (PL88-352) (45 CFR 611), and the regulations issued pursuant thereto.
- 2. <u>Debarment, Suspension, Repayment of Federal Debt</u>
 Subrecipient certifies that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any federal department or agency. Furthermore, Subrecipient certifies neither it nor its principals are delinquent on the repayment of any federal debt.
- 3. Audit Requirements
 - If Subrecipient is subject to Single Audit (2CFR200. Subpart F. Audit), Subrecipient hereby certifies that it meets the requirements of Single Audit and agrees to provide annual certifications of Single Audit compliance to AMERICAN COUNCILS for a period of one year following the termination of the subaward. In the event of audit findings, the Subrecipient agrees to send to AMERICAN COUNCILS its audit report including its corrective action plan within 30 days of the annual certification. In accordance with Single Audit, AMERICAN COUNCILS shall issue a management decision to the Subrecipient within sixty days. Failure to comply with audit requirements may result in the termination of the subaward. If Subrecipient is not subject to Single Audit (2CFR200. Subpart F. Audit) and expends more than \$750,000 per year in federal funds, Subrecipient certifies that an independent financial audit has been conducted for the most recently ended fiscal year and agrees to provide annual certification of completion to American Councils for a period of one year following termination of the subaward. In the event of audit findings, Subrecipient agrees to send to American Councils its audit report including its corrective action plan within 30 days of the annual certification. In accordance with Single Audit, American Councils shall issue a management decision to Subrecipient within 60 days. Failure to comply with audit requirements may result in a termination of the subaward.
